CONDITIONAL RESUMPTION OF FACE-TO-FACE CLASSES AFTER TYPHOON PEPITO

November 17, 2024 3:00 PM

Based on Tropical Cyclone Bulletin No. 18 issued at 2:00 PM on November 17, 2024, Albay remains under Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal (TCWS) No. 1. Consequently, face-to-face classes in pre-school, elementary, and high school, both private and public, are suspended for tomorrow, November 18, 2024. However, if Albay is no longer under TCWS No. 1 in the next bulletin, the suspension will be lifted immediately.

For colleges and universities, face-to-face classes shall resume tomorrow, November 18, 2024.

- 1. Safety Inspections and Discretionary Suspension: All schools must conduct thorough safety inspections of their campuses to ensure that buildings, classrooms, and surroundings are safe. Schools have the discretion to suspend their classes if they determine that conditions are not safe for students and personnel.
- 2. **Student Transportation and Support:** Schools should consider the circumstances of students from other island provinces and municipalities, such as Catanduanes, Masbate and Rapu-Rapu, who may face challenges in commuting. Students who are unable to attend face-to-face classes due to transportation difficulties or other concerns are requested to be excused and provided with alternative learning modalities.
