SUPER TYPHOON PEPITO 2



I. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Super Typhoon Pepito entered the PAR on November 14, 2024, it is currently located at 120 km East of Virac, Catanduanes [13.4 °N, 125.3°E] with maximum sustained winds of 195 kph near the center, and gustiness of up to 240 kph. ST Pepito is moving West Northwestward at 20 kph.

The Eastern portion of Albay is now under TCWS No. 4: Tiwi, Malinao, Tabaco, Malilipot, Bacacay and Rapu-Rapu; the rest of Albay is under TCWS No. 3.

Albay PDRRMC-APSEMO Advisory 27 was issued placing the entire province under the



state of readiness on November 13, 2024. Subsequent advisories 28, 29 and 30 were released directing concerned agencies and the public of specific instructions to mitigate the impacts of Pepito to include work and class suspension. Evacuation had been ordered on November 15, 2024 and had been completed before 5:00 PM of the same day except for few LGU's that were evacuating until the early morning of November 16, 2024.

- 7. Provided media updates and interviews for public information and instructions.


PHILIPPINE COAST GUARD - CGS ALBAY
