SUPER TYPHOON PEPITO 4
 November 17, 2024, 5:00 PM

I. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

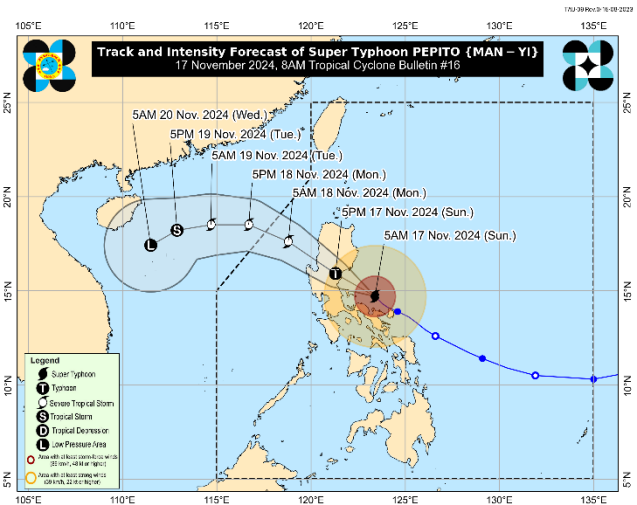
Super Typhoon Pepito entered the PAR on November 14, 2024, and is currently in the vicinity of Nagtipunan, Quirino [16.1 °N, 121.5 °E].

Albay is no longer under any TCWS.

As part of Albay's preparedness, several PDRRMC-APSEMO Advisory were issued placing the entire province under the state of readiness, directing concerned agencies and the public of specific instructions to mitigate the impacts of Pepito to include work and class suspension among others. Evacuation had

been ordered on November 15, 2024 and had been completed before 5:00 PM of the same day except for few LGU's that were evacuating until the early morning of November 16, 2024.

Albay PDRRMC-APSEMO issued Advisory No. 31 on November 17, 2024 for the decampment and lifting of work suspension both in government and private sectors; including resumption of classes both private and public schools at all levels.

4. Conducted pre-disaster coordination meeting and resource inventory with the response cluster.
5. Deployed vehicles to support evacuation of cities and municipalities.
6. Attended meetings with OCD V.
7. Maintained close coordination and monitoring with PAGASA for the latest weather update.
8. Provided media updates and interviews for public information and instructions.
