SITUATIONAL – ACTIVITY - MONITORING REPORT

TYPHOON UWAN - 02

November 8, 2025 as of 4:00 PM

I. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The center of the eye of Typhoon "UWAN" {FUNG-WONG} was estimated based on all available data at 605 km East of Catarman, Northern Samar or 700 km East of Legazpi City, Albay (12.9°N, 130.2°E) with maximum sustained winds of 150 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 185 km/h. It is moving West Northwestward at 30 km/h.

Stormy weather will be experienced over Bicol Region and Northern Samar, due to Typhoon UWAN. Possible flash floods or landslides due to intense to torrential rains. Minor to significant threat to life and property due to gale- to typhoon-force winds. Rains with gusty winds will be experienced over Oriental Mindoro, Marinduque and Romblon, due to Typhoon UWAN. Possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy with at times intense rains. Minimal to minor threat to life and property due to strong winds. Moderate to strong winds blowing from north to northwest will prevail along these areas and the coastal waters will be moderate to rough.

Based on DOST-PAGASA Tropical Cyclone Bulletin No. 3 issued November 8, 2025, 5:00 AM, the center of Typhoon UWAN was estimated based on all available data at 985 km East of Eastern Visayas (12.4°N, 133.7°E), with maximum sustained winds of 130 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 160 km/h. The storm is moving West northwestward at 25 km/h. Albay is now placed under TCWS No. 1.

In view of these threats and that the province may be directly affected by the storm, the PDRRMC-APSEMO hereby issues the following for disaster avoidance and public safety:

REITERATION OF PDRRMC-APSEMO ADVISORY NO. 41

EVACUATION

All LGUs and barangays are directed to **evacuate in SAFE evacuation facilities** population vulnerable to flood, flash flood, debris flow, lahar, destructive wind, landslide and storm surge including those with houses made of light materials and residing along coastal areas and riverbanks, to start today **November 8, 2025, and should be completed by 12:00 noon.**

All are directed to cooperate and stay on heightened alert, coordinate closely, and mobilize resources as needed and standby for official updates and further advisories from PAGASA and local authorities.

Based on DOST-PAGASA Tropical Cyclone Bulletin No. 4 issued November 8, 2025, 11:00 AM, the center of Typhoon UWAN was estimated based on all available data at 680 km East of Borongan City, Eastern Samar or 760 km East of Catarman, Northern Samar (12.6°N, 131.6°E), with maximum sustained winds of 140 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 170 km/h. The storm is moving Westward at 35 km/h. Albay is now placed under TCWS No. 2.

In view of these threats and that the province may be directly affected by the storm, the PDRRMC-APSEMO hereby issues the following for disaster avoidance and public safety:

EARLY DISMISSAL OF WORK FOR PRIVATE OFFICES AND ESTABLISHMENTS

Early dismissal of work in private offices/establishments this afternoon.

SUSPENSION OF WORK FOR PRIVATE OFFICES AND ESTABLISHMENTS

Work in private offices/establishments except for those that are crucial in the delivery of medical emergencies are hereby suspended effective tomorrow, November 9, 2025 until lifted.

All are directed to cooperate and stay on heightened alert, coordinate closely, and mobilize resources as needed and standby for official updates and further advisories from PAGASA and local authorities.
