Tropical Cyclone Bulletin #23

- “UWAN” CONTINUES TO WEAKEN WHILE MOVING NORTH NORTHEASTWARD TOWARDS TAIWAN.
- The center of Severe Tropical Storm UWAN was estimated based on all available data at 340 km West of Itbayat, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (20.4 °N, 118.6 °E)
- Moving North Northeastward at 15 km/h
- Maximum sustained winds of 100 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 125 km/h

DECAMPMENT AND LIFTING OF SUSPENSION OF WORK IN PRIVATE OFFICES/ESTABLISHMENTS

November 10, 2025
5:00 AM

Due to the improving weather condition and with Albay no longer under Typhoon Warning Signal, the public and respective LGU's are directed as follows:

1. DECAMPMENT of evacuated population to commence at 7:00 A.M. provided that C/MDRRMOs inspect and certify that it is safe for them to return to the community.
2. The LGU's concerned will facilitate the decampment and clean-up of the temporary shelters used.
3. Lifting of the suspension of work for private offices/establishment.
4. All city/municipal and barangay DRRMCs are advised to remain vigilant in their respective areas particularly those exposed to flood, lahar, flashflood and landslide and to remain alert and standby for official updates and further advisories from PAGASA and local authorities.
5. All C/MDRRMOs are directed to coordinate closely and submit reports.
