I. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

ALERT LEVEL STATUS : 3

VOLCANIC EARTHQUAKE: 0

PYROCLASTIC DENSITY CURRENT (PDC): 68

SULFUR DIOXIDE FLUX: 1318 tonnes/day on 15 January 2026

Based on the Tropical Cyclone Bulletin #8 issued at 05:00 AM, 16 January 2026 by the Philippine Atmospheric Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA), Tropical Depression "ADA" will affect the eastern coast of Southern Luzon on 16 to 17 January 2026. Due to its trajectory, "ADA" is expected to bring heavy to intense (100-200mm) rainfall that could generate volcanic sediment flows or lahars, muddy streamflow or muddy run-off in rivers and drainage areas of Mayon Volcano. DOST-PHIVOLCS thus strongly recommends increased vigilance and readiness of communities in pre-determined zones of lahar and related hazards in Albay Province [PHIVOLCS]
