VII. ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN

APSEMO

- 1. Maintained 24-hour PDOC operation and monitoring.
- 2. Consolidated situational reports from the LGU's and response clusters.
- 3. Provided information to various media stations
- 4. Continues monitoring with Phivolcs on Mayon Volcano status.
- 5. Provided data to the Office of the Congressman 2nd District on vulnerable population to Mayon and fisherfolks affected by shearline for relief distribution.
- 6. Provided gasoline (375 liters) to PEO Truck (Jan 6-9,2026)to augment transport of tents to Malilipot and evacuation to Tabaco and Camalig.

PROVINCIAL WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT OFFICE

- 1. Coordinated with the National Food Authority for the availability of rice.
- 2. Coordinated with local social welfare officers to submit evacuation reports as basis for relief.
- 3. Submit consolidated dromic report - Mayon Operation to APSEMO.

PROV'L ENGINEERING OFFICE

- 1. Provided 3 dump trucks and 3 personnel to support evacuation in Camalig, Albay.
- 2. Conducted inspection of evacuation centers to support utility requirements.
- 3. Provided dump truck to APSEMO to transport family tents to LGU Malilipot.

PROVINCIAL HEALTH OFFICE

- 1. Established evacuation centers and ensured safety, sanitation and health monitoring for evacuees.
- 2. Conducted continuous monitoring of situation and reporting of updates to APSEMO.
- 3. Emergency response teams activated and coordinated with local authorities.
- 4. Conduct Rapid Health Assessment to all identified Evacuation Centers.
- 5. Augmentation of Health Emergency Commodities to all Municipality/City.
- 6. Distribution of Hygiene Kits and Face Masks to identified evacuation centers.

PHILIPPINE ARMY

- 1. Coordinated with MDRRMO Guinobatan, MDRRMO Ligao and Albay PDRRMC for possible deployment.
- 2. Assist in the evacuation of affected population in Guinobatan and Ligao.
- 3. Coordinated/visited with PNP assigned at Brgy.Baligang and Baligang Elementary School Evacuation center, headed by PCPT REVALE.
- 4. MAJ TOMAMAK, Acting Battalion Executive Officer, took part in a coordination meeting on the possible deployment of additional reservist forces.

PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE

- 1. Coordinated with Albay PDRRMC and committed personnel to support security in evacuation centers and barangays along the 6-km radius PDZ.

MDRRMO- CAMALIG

- 1. Dissemination of 2026 Mayon Volcano Evacuation Plan.
- 2. Evacuation Cluster Meeting conducted.
- 3. Evacuation of Families inside the 6km PDZ
- 4. Activated the EOC for Mayon Operations 2026 located at the 1st floor of Camalig Command Center.
- 5. Duty presence of MDRRMO Personnels at Various Evacuation Centers.
- 6. Relief Operations Conducted at Evacuation Centers with the Presence of DSWD Regional Director Norman S. Laurio and Mayor Carlos Irwin G. Baldo

MDRRMO - GUINOBATAN

- 1. Continuous monitoring of weather updates.
- 2. Coordination meeting and pre-disaster risk assessment for Mayon Volcano 7km danger zone around Mayon Volcano and the barangays affected by shearline.
- 3. EOC activated and is placing cluster teams/ task force on standby status/Phil. Army in place for further instructions.
- 4. Submitted status report to APSEMO.

CDRRMO LEGAZPI

- 1. Continuous operations at the Emergency Operations Center
- 2. Disseminated safety precautions, weather bulletins, and other related information (e.g Heavy Rainfall Warnings) through the Legazpi City DRRMO's Facebook Page
- 3. Monitored Tandem Stations (Dita and San Francisco) and AWS for rainfall events
- 4. Recorded hourly rainfall volume.
- 5. Installed tents at Nuestra Señora de Salvacion Shrine c/o Task Force Kalinigan
- 6. Inspected water storage units at evacuation centers c/o Legazpi City Fire Station

X. DOCUMENTATION

APSEMO: Coordination and monitoring of Mayon Volcano response activities continue. The volcano remains at Alert Level 3 with ongoing emission of pyroclastic materials



Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) Albay and the Albay Public Safety and Emergency Management Office (APSEMO) held a meeting to discuss the increasing evacuation reports in comparison to the 6-kilometer Permanent Danger Zone (PDZ) population at risk data released by APSEMO. Following the meeting, APSEMO will draft a report analysis to further assess the situation and provide recommendations




