VII. ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN

APSEMO

1. Maintained 24-hour PDOC operation and monitoring.

2. Consolidate situational reports from the LGU's and response clusters.
3. Continues monitoring of Mayon Volcano Status with Phivolcs.
4. Provide instruction to Albay PPO and Phil. Army assigned on duty at the PDRRMC Operation Center for the evacuation procedures of the 7-8KM PDZ affected population due to the increased seismic energy release in Mayon Volcano incase alert level 4 is raised today.
5. Deployed the Phil. Army 49IB and 31IB with truck of KM450, KM250 Truck and Tonner Truck to Guinobatan, Daraga, Camalig, Legazpi, Malilipot, Sto. Domingo, Bacacay and Sto. Domingo.
6. Coordinated with C/ MDRRMOs of Mayon for the prepositioning of resources for possible evacuation in case the volcano status stepped up to Level 4.

#### **PROVINCIAL SOCIAL WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT OFFICE**

1. Coordinated with the National Food Authority for the availability of rice.
2. Coordinated with local social welfare officers to submit evacuation reports as basis for relief.
3. Submit consolidated dromic report - Mayon Operation to APSEMO.

#### **ALBAY PROVINCIAL HEALTH OFFICE**

3. Emergency response teams activated and coordinated with local authorities.
4. Conduct Rapid Health Assessment to all identified Evacuation Centers.
5. Augmentation of Health Emergency Commodities to all Municipality/City.

#### **PHILIPPINE ARMY**

1. Coordinated with MDRRMO Guinobatan, MDRRMO Ligao and Albay PDRRMC for possible deployment.
2. 31IB provided trucks and manpower at Daraga, Camalig, Legazpi, Malilipot, Bacacay, Sto. Domingo and Tabaco.
3. 49IB provided trucks and manpower to Guinobatan and standby at the Albay -PDOC.

3. Monitored Tandem Stations (Dita and San Francisco) and AWS for rainfall events page 4
4. Recorded hourly rainfall volume
5. Continuous monitoring of updates from PHIVOLCS and PAGASA through their website and other social media platforms.
6. Monitored CCTV live feed for possible flooding and incidents.
7. Continuous checkpoints to restrict entry to the 6km PDZ c/o Legazpi City Police Station.

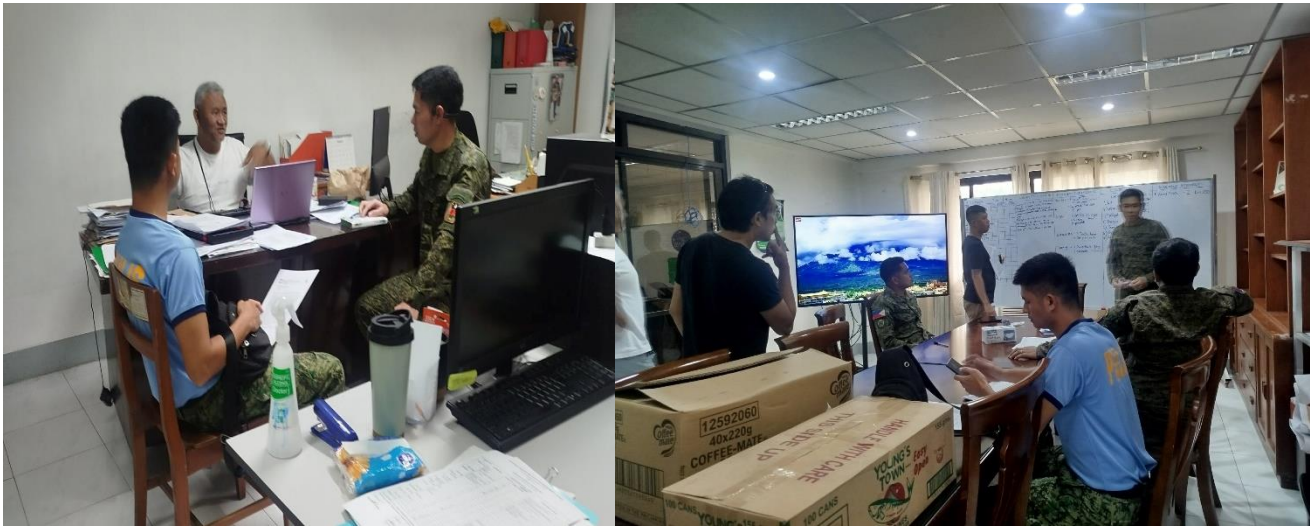
