VII. ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN

APSEMO

- Maintained 24-hour PDOC operation and monitoring.
- Consolidate situational reports from the LGU's and response clusters.
- Continues monitoring of Mayon Volcano Status with Phivolcs.
- Facilitated the possible donation of PCSO ,endorsed to PSWDO for allocation to identified barangays affected.
- Coordinated with the Phil Army for the distribution of resources to different LGUs.
- Provided Contingency Plan, list of families and individuals located within the 6-,7-,8-, and 9 kilometer danger zones to PNP from Camp Ola.

7. Attended response cluster meeting re: increased activity of Mayon Volcano.
8. Provided media interview with Radyo Siram, MNTV, Radyo Natin.

PROVINCIAL WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT OFFICE

1. Coordinated with the National Food Authority for the availability of rice.
2. Coordinated with local social welfare officers to submit evacuation reports as basis for relief.
3. Submit consolidated dromic report - Mayon Operation to APSEMO.

PROV'L ENGINEERING OFFICE

1. Provide 3 personnel on duty at the Albay PDOC.

PROVINCIAL HEALTH OFFICE

1. Established evacuation centers and ensured safety, sanitation and health monitoring for evacuees.
2. Conducted continuous monitoring of situation and reporting of updates to APSEMO.

PHILIPPINE ARMY

1. Coordinated with MDRRMO Guinobatan, MDRRMO Ligao and Albay PDRRMC for possible deployment.
2. Assist in the evacuation of affected population in Guinobatan and Ligao.
3. 49IB and 31IB truck and manpower on standby at Albay PDOC

ALBAY PROVINCIAL POLICE OFFICE

1. Coordinated with Albay PDRRMC and deployed personnel to support security in evacuation centers and barangays along the 6-km radius PDZ.

MDRRMO- CAMALIG

1. Activated the EOC for Mayon Operations 2026 located at the 1st floor of Camalig Command Center.
2. Duty presence of MDRRMO Personnels at Various Evacuation Centers.
3. Continuous monitoring of Mayon Volcano Status at Phivolcs.

MDRRMO GUINOBATAN

1. Continuous monitoring of volcano status from Phivolcs.
2. EOC activated and is placing cluster teams/ task force on standby status/Phil. Army in place for further instruction

CDRRMO LEGAZPI

1. Continuous operations at the Emergency Operations Center
2. Disseminated safety precautions, weather bulletins and other related information (e.g Heavy Rainfall Warnings) through the Legazpi City DRRMO's Facebook Page
3. Monitored Tandem Stations (Dita and San Francisco) and AWS for rainfall events page 4
4. Recorded hourly rainfall volume
5. Continuous monitoring of updates from PHIVOLCS and PAGASA through their website and other social media platforms.
6. Monitored CCTV live feed for possible flooding and incidents.
7. Continuous checkpoints to restrict entry to the 6km PDZ c/o Legazpi City Police Station.
8. Implemented road closure and assistance at Rosario Street (cor. Vinzon Street to cor. Locsin Street), Old Albay District, for parking space of military trucks for pre-emptive evacuation.

CDRRMO TABACO

2. Provided Status of evacuees to mainstream media via interview
3. Conducted monitoring of evacuation centers and providing needed resources to the

Evacuees.

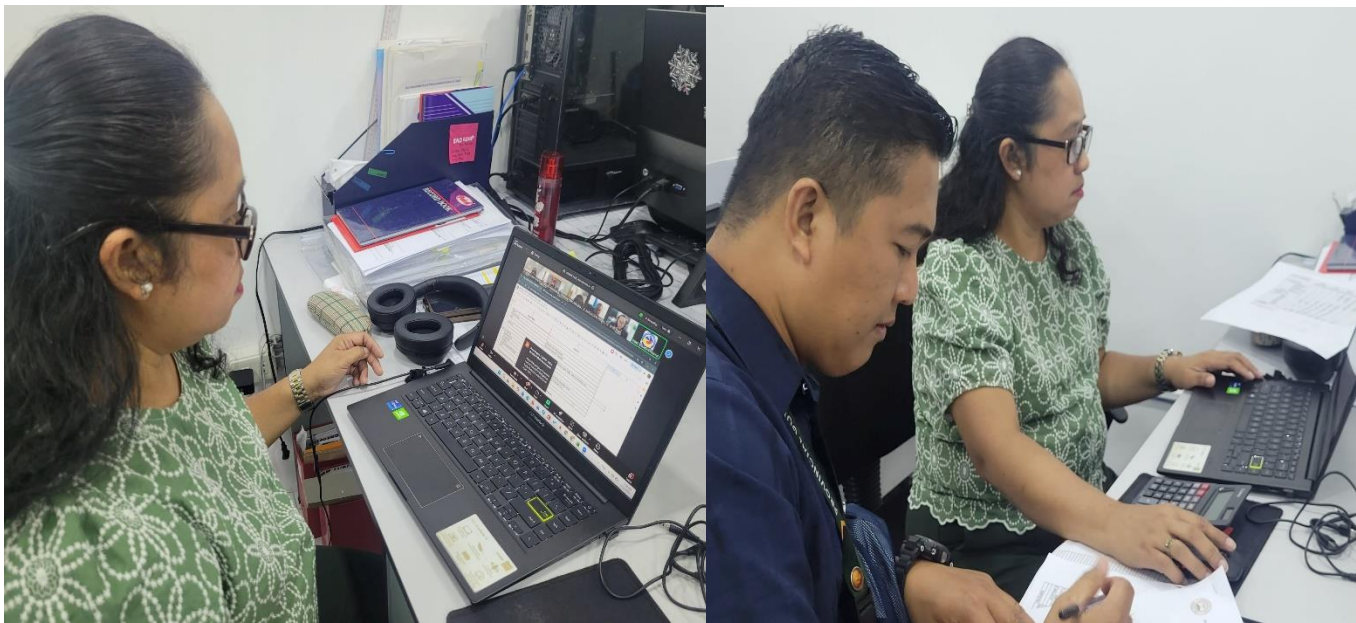
