APSEMO

1. Maintained 24-hour PDOC operation and monitoring.
2. Continues monitoring of Mayon Volcano Status with Phivolcs.
3. Consolidate situational reports from the LGU's and response clusters.
4. Maintained Mayon Eruption 2026 Joint Operation Center
5. Deployed 49IBARMY truck and manpower to transport jerry cans and boxes full of amenities From OVP Gogon to Muladbucad, Guinobatan and Baligang, Ligao City
6. Deployed 31IB Phil. Army Truck and manpower to transport jerry cans and boxes full of amenities from Gogon LC to Daraga covered court, Bariw and Tagaytay, Camalig, Albay.

PROV'L ENGINEERING OFFICE

1. Standy Dump Truck and manpower at Albay PDOC.

PROVINCIAL HEALTH OFFICE

1. The Provincial Health Office convened a consultation meeting with BRHMC, PDOHO, and major private hospitals within Albay.
2. The Albay Provincial Health Office, through the Provincial Epidemiology Surveillance Unit (PESU), conducted disease surveillance at San Jose Elementary School- Evacuation Center in Malilipot, Albay and facilitated the distribution of soaps and information, education, and communication (IEC) materials.
3. Assessment and monitoring have been conducted by the RHAS and Nutrition Teams in the identified evacuation centers within the 1st District.
4. Representative from the Philippine Red Cross, Mr. Ryan Marcello, coordinated with the Provincial Health Office-Disaster Risk Reduction and Management for Health (PHO-DRRMH), through the Nutrition Cluster, on the provision, and distribution of hot meals to all displaced individuals at the Buhian and Buang Evacuation Centers in Tabaco City.
5. The Albay Provincial Health Office Operations Center (OpCen) continues to operate 24/7, staffed continuously by the Health Emergency Management Staff (HEMS) to maintain uninterrupted monitoring, coordination, and response to any emerging health-related concerns linked to the ongoing situation.
6. The Provincial Health Office-Sanitation Division conducted an inspection of the toilet facility construction at the tent site in San Jose, Malilipot, Albay. The Sanitary inspectors confirmed that the location of the toilet facility is within the designated safe zone.

1. Continuous coordination with LSWDOs re: status report.
2. Monitoring visit to Evacuation Centers in Ligao City, Guinobatan at , Camalig, Malilipot, and Tabaco City.

ALBAY VETERINARY OFFICE

CDRRMO LEGAZPI

2. Disseminated safety precautions, weather bulletins, and other related information (e.g. Heavy Rainfall Warnings) through the Legazpi City DRRMO's Facebook Page.
3. Monitored Tandem Stations (Dita and San Francisco) and AWS for rainfall events
4. Recorded hourly rainfall volume
5. Continuous monitoring of updates from PHIVOLCS and PAGASA through their website and other social media platforms.
6. Monitored CCTV live feed for possible flooding and incidents.
7. Continuous checkpoints to restrict entry to the 6km PDZ c/o Legazpi City Police Station
8. Distribution of eggs from City Veterinary Office to PNP personnel deployed at Mabinit, Black lava, and Buyoan border control point facility.

MDRRMO GUINOBATAN

1. Inform the LCE about the Mayon Status
2. Continuous coordination with BDRRMC and evaluation of families living outside the 6-km PDZ
3. No entry on the 6-km PDZ with PNP and Barangay Tanod detailed on the entry point
4. Information Dissemination on Mayon Volcano Alert Level
5. Continuous monitoring of Mayon updates.
6. Monitoring of Mayon volcano air quality
7. Phil. Army in place for further instructions.
8. On blue alert status and stand by alert.
