The Mayon Volcano has present lava dome and lava flow effusion, with episodic minor strombolian activity; the plume height reaches 1000 meters above the crater with moderate emission and west drift, and its glow is fair (naked eye). Volcano edifice is inflated [PHIVOLCS]

### **APSEMO**

1. Maintained 24-hour PDOC operation and monitoring.
2. Continues monitoring of Mayon Volcano Status with Phivolcs.
3. Consolidate situational reports from the LGU's and response clusters.
4. Maintained Mayon Eruption 2026 Joint Operation Center
5. Deployed Army Trucks for distribution of relief goods within 3<sup>rd</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> District
6. Deployed PEO Truck for delivery of rice sacks to Ziga Hospital

### **PROV'L ENGINEERING OFFICE**

1. Standy Dump Truck and manpower at Albay PDOC.
2. Delivered rice sacks from APAO to Ziga Hospital.

### **PROVINCIAL HEALTH OFFICE**

1. RHAS Team conducted visitation and monitoring to the evacuation centers within 1<sup>st</sup> District.
2. The Albay Provincial Health Office, through the Provincial Epidemiology Surveillance Unit (PESU), conducted disease surveillance at San Jose Elementary School- Evacuation Center in Malilipot, Albay and facilitated the distribution of soaps and information, education, and communication (IEC) materials.
3. Provincial Health Office-Disaster Risk Reduction and Management for Health (PHO-DRRMH), through the Nutrition Cluster, on the provision, and distribution of hot meals to all displaced individuals at the Buhian and Buang Evacuation Centers in tabaco City.
4. The Albay Provincial Health Office Operations Center (OpCen) continues to operate 24/7, staffed continuously by the Health Emergency Management Staff (HEMS) to maintain uninterrupted monitoring, coordination, and response to any emerging health-related concerns linked to the ongoing situation.

1. Continuous coordination with LSWDOs re: status report.
2. Monitoring visit to Evacuation Centers in Ligao City, Guinobatan at, Camalig, Malilipot, and Tabaco City.

### **ALBAY VETERINARY OFFICE**

1. Continued monitoring of the status of animals at pooling sites.
2. Coordination with Department of Agriculture Regional Field Office 5 and affected CMLGUs.
3. Deployed AVO veterinary personnel and coordinated with concerned LGUs and Barangays.
4. Ongoing surveillance and inspection of validated animal pooling sites.
5. Prepared veterinary medical intervention supplies (medicines, vitamins, dewormers, antibiotics, etc.), companion and livestock animal feeds, supplies for feeding camp (drums, sakoline shed, waterer, etc.) and ropes.
6. Monitoring of Animal Pooling Site at Barangay Anoling and Quirangay of Camalig, Albay as well as Muladbucad Pequeño Pooling Site, Guinobatan, Albay.
7. Distributed Ruminant Feeds (50kg), Feeding Trough/Drums, and Ropes (10 meters).
8. Conducted veterinary medical interventions such as deworming, vitamin supplementation, checkup, and treatment.

4. Information Dissemination on Mayon Volcano Alert Level
5. Continuous monitoring of Mayon updates.
6. Monitoring of Mayon volcano air quality
7. Phil. Army in place for further instructions.
8. On blue alert status and stand by alert


