The Mayon Volcano has present lava effusion with lava flow on Basud (3.8 km) and Mi-isi (1.3 km) gullies; The crater glow is fair (naked eye). The plume is 400 meters above the crater; moderate emission; west-northwest and southwest drift. Volcano edifice is inflated. [PHIVOLCS]

Cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms due to Shear Line will be experienced over Mayon volcano. High Risk Areas will be affected by ashfall due to East-Northeast winds in Camalig, Guinobatan, and some parts of Daraga until February 14, 2026 until further notice. [PAGASA]

PROVINCIAL HEALTH OFFICE

1. Coordinated with the United Nations Children (UNICEF) Philippines—Nutrition in Emergencies Section and the Department of Health Center for Health Development (DOH) Bicol.
2. Facilitated and monitored the distribution of Ready-to-Use Therapeutic Food (RUTF) donated by UNICEF in the Malilipot and Tabaco City.
3. Assisted to local health workers in conducting nutrition assessment to validate the nutritional status of the children and to identify those who may require therapeutic feeding and further intervention.
4. The PHO Operations Center remains on 24/7 operational status, continuously manned by the Health Emergency Management Staff (HEMS) to ensure sustained monitoring, effective coordination, and timely response to any emerging health concerns related to the ongoing situation.
5. The Albay Provincial Health Office (PHO), through the Provincial Epidemiology Surveillance Unit (PESU), in coordination with the respective Municipal Epidemiology Surveillance Units (MESUs), continues close and regular monitoring of all identified evacuation centers to evaluate their current conditions and promptly respond to any health-related issues or concerns.
6. The Health Promotion distributed supplementary information, education, and Communication (IEC) materials and carried out a health needs assessment among evacuees in the identified evacuation centers.

ALBAY VETERINARY OFFICE

1. Coordination meeting with Assistant Secretary for Ruminant Livestock Dr. Benjamin C. Albarece together with DARFO 5 Livestock Division Head Mr. Marianito A. Tesorero re: Mayon Volcano Practices, Updates, Issues and Concerns.
2. Monitoring of Animal Pooling Site at Barangay Bogna, Bacacay, Albay.
 - a. Conducted veterinary medical interventions such as deworming, vitamin supplementation, checkup, and treatment.
 - b. Provision of Ruminant Feeds (50kg), Feeding Trough/Drums, and Ropes (10 meters).
 - c. Conducted Ear Tagging & Registration of Animals.
 - d. Conducted orientation to affected livestock raisers.
3. Conducted orientation of farmers for the Implementation of a Cash for Work (CFW) Program under the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD).
4. Coordination with Department of Agriculture Regional Field Office 5 and affected CMLGUs.
5. Ongoing surveillance and inspection of validated animal pooling sites.
6. Prepared and conducted inventory of veterinary medical intervention supplies (medicines, vitamins, dewormers, antibiotics, etc.), companion and livestock animal feeds, supplies for feeding camp (drums, sakoline shed, feeding trough/drums, etc.) and ropes.
7. Continued monitoring of the status of animals at pooling sites.

4. Conducted an intensified Police Visibility/Presence operation in relation to the Alert Level Status of Mt. Mayon Volcano within the 6–7-kilometer Permanent Danger Zone (PDZ) at Brgy. Bañadero, Daraga Albay
5. Conducted evacuation assistance, dialogue, police visibility operations and established WCPD help desk to ensure peace and order, prevent gender-based violence and provide necessary police response and assistance.
6. Provincial Mobile Force Company continuously conducted Border Control Point Monitoring police visibility operations to prevent entry/exit in high-risk areas, and ensure public safety
7. Conducted a Drone Patrol at Black Lava OP Brgy. Mabinit, Legazpi City Albay..


