The Mayon Volcano has present lava effusion with lava flow on Basud (3.8 km) and Mi-isi (1.3 km) gullies; The crater glow is fair (naked eye). The plume is obscured. Volcano edifice is inflated. [PHIVOLCS]

Cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms due to Shear Line will be experienced over Mayon volcano. Impact: Possible flash floods/landslides from moderate to heavy rains. CRITICAL: Tabaco, Malilipot, Malinao. E-NE winds (40kph). Direct hit risk for gas/ash today. HIGH: Camalig, Guinobatan, Ligao. E-SE winds thru Feb 15. High ashfall risk if plume hits 3km+. MODERATE: Legazpi, Daraga. Upper winds shift South by Feb 16, 2026; fine ash risk to North. Check LGU for updates. [PAGASA]

4. Maintained Mayon Eruption 2026 Joint Operation Center.
5. Coordinated with Social Actions Office regarding the Mayon Volcano Updates.
6. Coordination Meeting with Start Network (People in Need, OXFAM, Simon of Cyrene, Coastal Core, MIDAS) for LGU's affected by Mayon Eruption
7. Continues monitoring of Shear line and Northeast Monsoon

PROV'L ENGINEERING OFFICE

1. Standby Dump Truck and manpower at Albay PDOC.

PROVINCIAL HEALTH OFFICE

1. Conducted Rapid Health Assessment at Tagaytay Evacuation Center and Bariw Evacuation Center in Camalig and Baligang Evacuation Center in Ligao City to ensure the immediate health needs of internally displaced families are properly identified and addressed.
2. The Operations Center (OpCen) hotline remains fully operational, with no calls or inquiries received for the reporting period.
3. The PHO Operations Center remains on 24/7 operational status, continuously manned by the Health Emergency Management Staff (HEMS) to ensure sustained monitoring, effective coordination, and timely response to any emerging health concerns related to the ongoing situation.
4. The Albay Provincial Health Office (PHO), through the Provincial Epidemiology Surveillance Unit (PESU), in coordination with the respective Municipal Epidemiology Surveillance Units (MESUs), continues close and regular monitoring of all identified evacuation centers to evaluate their current conditions and promptly respond to any health-related issues or concerns.
5. The Provincial Health Office's official Facebook page continues to serve as a key platform for the dissemination of health advisories, public information, and online health promotion materials, particularly those related to the ongoing activity of Mayon Volcano.

ALBAY VETERINARY OFFICE

1. Coordination meeting of PAEMT with City Veterinarian of Tabaco City Dr. Kim Ronan O. Romero.
2. Monitoring of Animal Pooling Site at Barangay Barangay Sua and Tumpa, Camalig, Albay.
 - a. Conducted veterinary medical interventions such as deworming, vitamin supplementation, checkup, and treatment.
 - b. Provision of Ruminant Feeds (50kg), Feeding Trough/Drums, and Ropes (10 meters).
 - c. Conducted Ear Tagging & Registration of Animals.
 - d. Conducted orientation to affected livestock raisers.
 - e. Setup of feeding camps
3. Continued monitoring of the status of animals at pooling sites.
4. Coordination with Department of Agriculture Regional Field Office 5 and affected CMLGUs.
5. Deployed AVO veterinary personnel and coordinated with concerned LGUs and Barangays.
6. Prepared and conducted inventory of veterinary medical intervention supplies (medicines, vitamins, dewormers, antibiotics, etc.), companion and livestock animal feeds, supplies for feeding camp (drums, sakoline shed, feeding trough/drums, etc.) and ropes.


