Lava effusion w/ lava flow on Basud (3.8 km), Bonga (3.2 km), and Mi-isi (1.3 km) gullies; The crater glow is fair (naked eye). The plume is on Moderate emission; west-southwest drift. Volcano has a short-term deflation of the edifice with shorter-term inflation on the northeastern flank. [PHIVOLCS]

## **VI. ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN**

### **APSEMO**

1. Released PDRRMC-APSEMO ADVISORY- 2026 – 12.
2. Maintained 24-hour PDOC operation and monitoring.
3. Consolidate situational reports from the LGU's and response clusters.
4. Maintained Mayon Eruption 2026 Joint Operation Center.
5. Released updates and provided media interview for public awareness and information.
6. Deployed PEO 2 Water trucks, 1 grader truck, and 1 dump truck with manpower at Guinobatan and Camalig for clearing operation.
7. Provided timely information to various agencies.

### **PROVINCIAL HEALTH OFFICE**

1. The Provincial Health Office thru the Health Emergency Operations Center (HEOC) handed over:
  - Camalig RHU – distributed 10 boxes of Aquatabs.
  - Guinobatan RHU – distributed 1 box 400 pcs n95 plus 2,000 surgical masks and 10 box of aquatabs.
  - Ligao CHO - distributed 10 boxes of Aquatabs.
2. The Operations Center (OpCen) hotline remains fully operational.
3. The Provincial Health Office's official Facebook page continues to serve as a key platform for the dissemination of health advisories, public information, and online health promotion materials, particularly those related to the ongoing activity of Mayon Volcano.

### **PROVINCIAL ENGINEERING OFFICE**

1. Provided one (1) water lorry truck in Guinobatan, one (1) water lorry truck, one (1) grader, and one (1) dump truck in Camalig.

### **ALBAY VETERINARY OFFICE**

1. Continuous distribution of ruminant feeds to Brgy. Anoling, Sua, Tumpa and Quirangay.
2. Continued monitoring and assessment of the actual field situation to document, validate and quantify damages and losses to livestock and companion animals.
3. Coordination with Department of Agriculture Regional Field Office 5 and affected CMLGUs.
4. Deployed AVO veterinary personnel and coordinated with concerned LGUs and Barangays.
5. Prepared and conducted inventory of veterinary medical intervention supplies (medicines, vitamins, dewormers, antibiotics, etc.), companion and livestock animal feeds, supplies for feeding camp (drums, sakoline shed, feeding trough/drums, etc.) and ropes.

### **BUREAU OF FIRE PROTECTION-ALBAY**

1. Deployed a total 183 personnels consisting of 151 fire suppression, 17, Special Rescue Force, and 15 EMS. Also, a total of 28 vehicles consisting of 24 firetrucks, 2 rescue truck, and 2 ambulances.
2. Conducted road flushing/clearing and water tankering.

### **MDRRMO GUINOBATAN**

1. Inform the LCE about the Mayon Status
2. Continuous coordination with BDRRMC and evaluation of families living outside the 6-km PDZ
3. No entry on the 6-km PDZ with PNP and Barangay Tanods detailed on the entry point

4. Information Dissemination on Mayon Volcano Alert Level
5. Continuous monitoring of Mayon updates.
6. Monitoring of Mayon volcano air quality
7. Phil. Army in place for further instructions.
8. On blue alert status and stand by alert.
9. Ongoing flushing of roads and areas with the aid different units of BFP from the province of Albay, Camarines sur, Sorsogon, and Masbate.
10. Ongoing distribution of facemask to the public.
11. Strict compliance and implementation of MDRRMC Advisory No. 3 s. 2026 adopting PDRRMC – APSEMO Advisory – 2026 -12.
12. Strict compliance and implementation of MDRRMC Advisory No. 4 s. 2026 directing all barangays to defer or reschedule fiesta-related events.
13. Strict compliance to MDRRMC Advisory No. 5 s. 2026 – Suspension of Classes in all levels both public and private schools within the municipality including school non-teaching personnel effective tomorrow, May 4, 2025 until lifted.
14. Strict compliance to MDRRMC ADVISORY No. 6 s. 2026 – set of advices to follow regarding the Mayon Volcano Alert Level 3 Ashfall.
15. Ongoing Water rationing to the different Barangays.
16. Ongoing Potable water rationing to the different Barangays.
17. The MDRRMO recommends to put the municipality under the state of calamity.
