## MAYON VOLCANO OPERATION ACTIVITY/MONITORING REPORT 132-2026

June 17, 2026 – 5:00 PM

### I. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

DATE: June 17, 2026

#### SUMMARY OF 24HR OBSERVATION (12 AM yesterday to 12 AM today)

ALERT LEVEL STATUS: **3**  
VOLCANIC EARTHQUAKES: **8 including 3 tremors (7-8 min. long)**  
ROCKFALL EVENTS: **248**  
PYROCLASTIC DENSITY CURRENT (PDC): **1**  
SULFUR DIOXIDE FLUX: **1,395 tonnes / day (16 June 2026)**

Lava effusion with lava flow on Basud (3.8 km), Bonga (3.2 km), and Mi-isi (1.8 km) gullies, with episodic minor strombolian activity; The crater glow is fair (naked eye). The plume reaches 300 meters above the crater with weak emission with west, west-northwest and northwest drift. It has short-term deflation of the edifice with shorter-term inflation on the northeastern flank [PHIVOLCS]

##### **APSEMO**

1. Released PDRRMC-APSEMO ADVISORY- 2026 – 12.
2. Maintained 24-hour PDOC operation and monitoring.
3. Consolidate situational reports from the LGU's and response clusters.
4. Released updates and provided media interview for public awareness and information.
5. Continuous monitoring with PHIVOLCS on Mayon Volcano status.

##### **PROVINCIAL HEALTH OFFICE**

1. Conducted regular Rapid Health Assessments and distributed essential health and sanitation supplies to evacuation centers in Albay.
2. Distributed essential water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) supplies, including Bestar, chlorine, and Aquatabs, to evacuation centers in the municipalities of Camalig, Malilipot, and the cities of Tabaco and Ligao.
3. The Department of Health Bicol Center for Health Development (DOH Bicol CHD), in partnership with the Provincial Health Office (PHO) and Rural Health Unit (RHU) of Malilipot, conducted PuroKalusugan: Alagang Pangkalusugan sa Evacuation Center at the Malilipot Tent City in San Jose, Malilipot, Albay.
4. Provided medical consultations, deployed the Mobile PCF to deliver basic laboratory services, and supported health education initiatives for evacuees to promote disease prevention and overall well-being.

##### **MDRRMO GUINOBATAN**

1. Inform the LCE about the Mayon Status
2. Continuous coordination with BDRRMC and evaluation of families living outside the 6-km PDZ.
3. No entry on the 6-km PDZ with PNP and Barangay Tanods detailed on the entry point.
4. Information Dissemination on Mayon Volcano Alert Level.
5. Continuous monitoring of Mayon updates.
6. Monitoring of Mayon volcano air quality
7. Phil. Army in place for further instructions.
8. On blue alert status and stand by alert.
9. Ongoing flushing of roads and areas.
10. Ongoing distribution of facemask to the public.
11. Strict compliance and implementation of MDRRMC Advisory No. 3 s. 2026 adopting PDRRMC – APSEMO Advisory – 2026 -12.
12. Strict compliance to MDRRMC ADVISORY No. 6 s. 2026 – set of advices to follow regarding the Mayon Volcano Alert Level 3 Ashfall.
13. Ongoing Water rationing to the different Barangays.
14. Ongoing Potable water rationing to the different Barangays.
15. Guinobatan is under the State of Calamity based on the resolution approved by the Sangguniang Bayan.

16. Relief Distribution by different agencies and NGOs facilitated by LGU Guinobatan, MDRRMO, and MSWDO.
17. Assistance provided/distributed to farmers affected by the ashfall in the Municipality.
18. Issuance of MDRRMC Advisory No. 9 s. 2026 – Lifting of MDRRMC Advisory No. 4 s. 2026

#### **CDRRMO LIGAO CITY**

1. Coordinated with the barangay DRRM Officials and ensure the activation of the BDRRM Council.
